VICTORY: Dominating the Competition

From 6-9 March, MIDN of the Trojan Battalion traveled to Boulder, CO, to compete in the annual CU Boulder Meet. This marked the Battalion's return to the competition since 2019, making their participation in the event's 30th anniversary even more significant. Boulder hosted 21 schools across six competitions, with USC proudly participating in five: Knowledge, Drill, Color Guard, Shooting, and Endurance Race. The 17 participating MIDN primarily composed of underclassman who brought determination and resilience to every event.

Starting the meet on a high, the USC Knowledge Team, under the leadership of MIDN 2/C Williams, dominated the competition to take home the first-place trophy. They faced off against the Denver Marine Officer Selection team, UC Berkeley, CU Boulder, and finally, Minnesota in the championship round. A crucial moment came when Staff Sergeant Arzate provided valuable historical information on the first female Marine allowing the team to challenge the judges and win a decisive battle against CU Boulder. In the finals, MIDN 4/C Sommerfield delivered the winning answer in Final Jeopardy, sealing the team's victory.

Led by MIDN 4/C Zendejas as unit leader and MIDN 4/C Donahoe as squad leader, the Drill Team demonstrated precision and discipline on the drill deck. Under the freezing 30 degree weather, the team showcased their hard work, tying for first with the University of Oklahoma. The team narrowly missed victory by just 0.5 points in a tiebreaker. Under the guidance of Staff Sergeant Arzate since early January, the team showcased their dedication and skill bringing home another well-earned trophy for USC.

While the remaining teams-Color Guard, Shooting, and the Endurance Race Team-did not secure podium finishes, they exemplified USC's resilience and determination. The Endurance Team, led by MIDN 3/C Breen, faced the toughest challenge of the weekend: a grueling competition consisting of a swimming portion, followed by a 3 A.M wake up with an intense mountain endurance race. Demonstrating warrior toughness, the team executed rigorous exercises while summiting the mountain, completing the event in nearly eight hours. Despite the physical toll, the team took pride in their perseverance and camaraderie. The dogs they met on the way made it even more bearable.

Beyond the contests, the MIDN explored the city of Boulder, strengthening their bonds through group hikes at Chautauqua Park, shared meals, and well-earned liberty in the city. Unfortunately, there was no pancaking eating contest, but the legacy of our alumni won't be undone. This trip wasn't solely about trophiesit was about legacy, growth, and proving what a young but determined group could accomplish together.





Run, Rest, Repeat: Running for the Pack


