Program Overvie

The Price Scholars for Community Enrichment Internships Fund supports Price master's students dedicated to making a positive impact in Southern California communities. The Fund provides awards of up to \$7,500 for students who secure unpaid or underpaid summer internships with public service, nonprofit, or community-focused organizations.

Through these internships,

- Gain hands-on professional experience
- Build confidence and practical skills
- Contribute to organizations making a tangible difference in Southern
- California Benefit from faculty mentorship and the support of a peer

Student Eligibility

- Current Price master's students graduating in or after Fall 2026.
- Progressive degree students enrolled in master's-level coursework are eligible.
- Applicants must have already secured an internship or be awaiting the final stages of selection.

Internship Criteria

- Internship experiences must be substantive, project- and task-based work that directly or indirectly positively impacts communities in Southern California.
- Internship must span 10 weeks (30 to 35 hours per week) and take place during summer (May–August)
- Priority will be given to unpaid or underpaid opportunities.
 While public and nonprofit roles are prioritized, small businesses engaged in



Application Process

Applicants must submit the following:

- 1. Online Application (link provided when applications open)
- 2. Current Resume
- 3. Personal Essay (1-page, single-spaced, 10pt font minimum) covering:
 - Your academic program
 - How your work will impact Southern California communities
 - How the internship will enhance your academic and career goals
- 4. Proof of Internship, including: Offer letter on organization letterhead and Job description with clear duties and responsibilities.

Internship Sourcing

Students may secure opportunities through two pathways:

- **Independent Search:** Source your own internship that meets the internship criteria.
- **Pre-Approved PCE Opportunities:** Career Services and faculty partners will promote qualifying opportunities. Organizations may submit job descriptions for approval, which will be highlighted for students. *Note: Preapproval does not quarantee applicants*

Selection Process

Awardees are chosen based on the strength of their application, including demonstrated written and verbal communication skills.
